# Call for Proposals Released for Junior PHSSR Investigator Awards

Ten Grants of Up to \$10,000 Each to be Awarded

LEXINGTON, KY.-Promising junior investigators interested in pursuing a career in public health services and systems research (PHSSR) are encouraged to apply for a <a href="new round of funding">new round of funding</a> aimed at increasing the number of qualified investigators in PHSSR. The <a href="National Coordinating Center for PHSSR">National Coordinating Center for PHSSR's</a> sixth round of <a href="Junior Investigator Awards">Junior Investigator Awards</a> provides a mentored research experience that gives awardees an opportunity to work closely with prominent PHSSR experts as they launch their careers. These \$10,000 fixed-price awards are available for doctoral candidates or junior faculty who are within three years of their initial faculty appointment. Up to 10 one-year awards are available in this round of funding. Up to five of these awards will be mentored by researchers from member networks of the <a href="Public Health Practice-Based Research">Public Health Practice-Based Research</a> Networks (PBRN) program.

Proposals are due on Wednesday, Dec. 5, 2012, with award notification in mid-January 2013. The awards are scheduled to begin in February/March 2013.
