Notable Recent Activities

Round I January Conference Call. Networks discussed a revised network analysis draft instrument that included their most recent comments, along with the initial research protocol. National Coordinating Center (NCC) Staff plan to pilot test the instrument with an Arkansas health coalition by month's end prior to rolling out the finalized instrument in early to mid February. Each network will provide organization names to the NCC to prepopulate the instrument and will then distribute to their respondents electronically or in hard copy. The NCC will generate descriptive reports of network interaction from the completed surveys and will provide copies of the raw data to the PBRNs to share with members for more in-depth interpretation. Final comments on the instrument draft are due by January 21.

A networking plan is being developed to enhance communication among networks on special interest topics, such as instrument sharing, variation in local public health practice on emergent issues, measuring regionalization, generating interest in research from local public health agencies, ideas for multi-PBRN projects, and more. All twelve networks should watch for an email from the NCC on converging research topics and communication mechanisms into a useful, convenient format.

- PBRN Annual Grantee and NAC Meetings. Plans for the Annual Meeting format are being discussed in the January conference calls with networks. The proposed plan is for the PBRN Grantee Meeting to begin on Monday morning, April 19, and conclude on Tuesday afternoon, April 20, just prior to the Keeneland Conference opening session. The NAC also would meet on Tuesday afternoon.

CALLS FOR PROPOSALS

✤ APHA is accepting abstract submissions for the 2010 Annual Meeting. The conference theme is Social Justice: Public Health Imperative. Abstracts are due February 1-5, 2010. Link to details. AcademyHealth Interest Groups Calls for Papers. Interest Groups (IG) issue separate <u>calls for papers</u> for their meetings held in conjunction with the Annual Research Meeting (ARM). All IG abstracts are due February 15, 2010, including the Public Health Systems Research (PHSR) IG <u>detailed here</u>. The PHSR meeting is June 29-30 immediately following the ARM.

CONFERENCES

- NIH Conference on the Science of Dissemination and Implementation: Methods and Measurement will be in Bethesda, MD on March 15-16, 2010. Conference Registration Deadline: February 12, 2010. "Researchers and evaluators who are interested in identifying opportunities and obstacles for dissemination and implementation research/evaluation are encouraged to attend this meeting. The goal is to engage in dialog, exchange ideas, explore contemporary topics and challenge one another to identify and test research designs, methods and measurement that will advance dissemination and implementation science." Investigators may request 15-minute individual sessions with relevant NIH program staff to discuss research ideas. To request an individual session, submit a one-page abstract by January 29 following the instructions at the link above.
- Community-Campus Partnerships for Health (CCPH). The CCPH annual conference will be May 12-15, 2010 in Portland, Oregon. - Tax Policy and Alcohol Consumption. - Oral Health. Two new or updated information resources on oral health as part of the broader health picture are available. <u>Training New Dental Health Providers in the US</u>, authored by Burton L. Edelstein, DDS MPH, and released by the Kellogg Foundation, focuses on provider and policy issues. Funding Opportunities

- Time-Sensitive Research in Environmental Health Sciences. NIH has announced availability of the two funding mechanisms to "support research in which an unpredictable opportunity has arisen to collect human or animal biosample baseline or exposure data (e.g., following natural or mademade disasters, health care policy changes; etc). The distinctive element of the project should be the need for empirical study for a situation that was not foreseeable and is achievable only if begun within a short time frame."

- Environmental Health Specialists Network (EHS-Net) Research (U01) Grant. CDC's EHS-Net grant aims to strengthen environmental health service programs through a network of environmental health specialists who will work with epidemiologists and laboratorians in the areas of foodborne and waterborne illnesses. Note the specifics regarding eligible applicants. Deadlines: Letter of Intent due by February 12, 2010; application due by March 15, 2010. <u>Announcement</u>
- Community Action for A Renewed Environment Program (CARE). The Environmental Protection Agency has issued a RFP for its CARE program, "a unique community-based,

community-driven, multimedia demonstration program designed to help communities understand and reduce risks due to toxic pollutants and environmental concerns from all sources." - Finding Answers: Disparities Research for Change. RWJF has announced a national initiative to move disparities research beyond documentation and into the implementation of efforts to eliminate racial and ethnic differences in health care.
